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High School with CRHSAP

The mission of the Cedar Rapids Home School Assistance Program is to provide an educational alternative that benefits homeschooling families, meets the educational requirements of the school district, builds community and considers the best interest of the student.

The Cedar Rapids Home School Assistance Program offers a high school diploma to homeschool students who fulfill the requirements for graduation. The students must successfully complete at least 40 credits for graduation as specified by the Cedar Rapids Community School District.

Meeting the 40 Credit Requirements

Distribution of Credits

- 8 credits of Language Arts
 - Required: 2 credits each of LA 9 and LA 10
- 6 credits of Mathematics
 - .25 must be Financial Literacy (Economics can meet this requirement)
- 6 credits of Science
 - Required: Physical Science
- 6 credits of Social Studies
 - Required: 2 credits of U.S. History and 1 credit of U.S. Government
- 4 credits of Physical Education and 1 credit of Health is recommended
- 10 credits of Elective Study
- CPR certification (pass/fail) (recommended)

Qualifying Credit

- Credit completion includes:
 - Minimum of 60 hours of coursework
 - Work log tracking the 60 hours of work
 - Binder of completed work
- Courses successfully completed at one of the following institutions:
 - public or private high school
 - Iowa Big
 - Accredited online program such as Switched on Schoolhouse, CRVA, Abeka or Acellus

Reporting and Record Keeping

- The home school parent and student are responsible for keeping track of hours, grades and credits and provide documentation to their resource teacher.
- CRHSAP will provide templates to facilitate the record keeping process.
- Parents/students will be required to provide evidence of completed work that corresponds with hourly records every quarter.

Transfer of Credits

- High school credits earned prior to enrolling in CRHSAP will be reviewed upon the receipt of a transcript.
- Credits earned for a home-taught, Edgenuity, or private non-accredited course will not transfer to CRCSD high schools.

Graduation

- Students who successfully meet the requirements for graduation from CRHSAPand the Cedar Rapids CSD will be recognized at a graduation ceremony in May.
- Students are required to purchase a cap and gown for the ceremony.

- Alternative Concurrent Enrollment is available through Kirkwood for qualifying 11th and 12th grade students.

TRACKING CREDITS AND COURSES

Both the **CRHSAP Graduation Progress Form** and the **CRHSAP Official Transcript Form** are important in keeping track of your high school student's progress toward graduation. They provide similar information, but have two different purposes.

CRHSAP Graduation Progress Form

The graduation progress form is a working document used throughout the year to track student progress in core subjects, electives and PE. The grid has two columns and multiple rows. Each *row* in the grid is equivalent to 120 hours or 2 credits. Each *box* is the equivalent of 60 hours or 1 semester of work.

For example, the student below took English Literature 9 and recorded 120 hours of work, so the entire top row is filled under Language Arts to show the student completed two credits of English Literature 9. Since the student also took a one-semester course called, Novels, at their local high school, one box is filled to show the completion of one semester of work or 60 hours.

Official Transcript Form


The official transcript form documents progress from year to year. End of course grades are reported at the end of each semester and documented. Once graduation requirements are met, the parent/guardian, resource and lead teacher will review and finalize the official transcript.

• A student on track for graduation should complete at least ten credits a year.






